Table App. 1. Interviews conducted

All interviews were conducted by the author in a face-to-face setting and lasted between 60 and 90 minutes. Questions involved general aspects of Africa-EU relations, the efforts of the AU, EU and UN in the Central African Republic, and detailed insights into the operations' effectiveness and conditions constraining or conducive to the outcome of the interventions. The author guaranteed the interviewees full anonymity.

2. Search in the Nexis-database conducted for this article

For this article, I have conducted a specific query in the Nexis-database, accessed via <u>http://www.nexisuni.com</u>. This query searched for any reports associated with the AU-EU efforts in the Central African Republic between 2011 and 2015 in order to additionally collect background information on the conflict.

The press reports were systematically collected, auto-standardised, and prepared for coding by using *atlas.ti*, and structural coded using the software *MAXQDA*. The press reports refer to sources from news agencies such as Africa News, BBC, Reuters, DPA, AFP, Xinhua, Wire, and many others, and include African news agencies. In order to provide for insights into the development of conflicts and previous engagements in a crisis, press reports were collected before and after the engagement.

These searches allow for replication using the same queries and time periods (replication has been tested several times by the author).
